## Whitefish Point Bird Observatory

One of the leading observatories in the country, offering a unique glimpse at the spectacular migration of Hawks, Loon, Eagles, Peregrine Falcon, Boreal, Saw-what, Great Gray, Snowy Owls, and songbirds.

## Whitefish Point Lighthouse and Great Lakes Shipwreck Museum

Experience the gripping tales of ships and men who braved Superior's cold deep waters and violent raging storms. The site of Superior's first lighthouse still stands guard over the ships that round its point.

## Fishing

The Paradise area has many bankfishing localities. You can expect to find Perch, Pike, Muskie, Walleye, Whitefish, Steel-head, Brown Trout, Salmon and other varieties of Michigan fish.
